- Treasurer Report Budget Report

 - o Current balance \$22,918.12
 - o Reimbursements are up-to-date.

- New Business: Summer 2021 Plans in Brookline!
 - Beautification Lisa Wilson and Blake Playchak
 - We received approval of our zoning permit for the shed we are purchasing; we are still waiting for the building permit.
 - The wheelbarrow raffle is up & running see our website and Facebook page for more information. It has a \$220 value and is great for gardeners! Tickets are \$3 each. The winner will be drawn on June 5th at the end of the Community Yard Sale
 - Additional cleanups on Brookline Blvd are being planned stay tuned for dates
 - Our Love Your Block Grant is being submitted shortly, with help from a new Beautification committee member with relevant experience
 - Community Engagement
 - We have a billboard up in the community! Go find it, and let Melissa Kilmer know when you see where it is. ②
 - Community Yard Sale: June 5th
 - Spots at the Rec Center are sold out, but you can still sign up to sell at your own house.
 - South Side BBQ will be at the Rec Center
 - Over 40 signups so far for the Yard Sale, including several Brookline Blvd businesses that will be selling out front
 - Any Brookline Together member business who wants to join the yard sale will not be charged any registration fee.

- Deadline for signup is Friday, May 21st, to allow sufficient time to make the maps of all of the participating houses and put up signs at each participating house
- Advertisements have been placed in Nextdoor, Craigslist, Facebook, and may be in one or more of the local newspapers
- Maps of participating houses will be available at Scoops on the Blvd and 802 Bean Company as well as at the Brookline Together table at the Rec Center
- Breezefest: August 14th
 - Stages + Music
 - Food trucks we have 2 food trucks signed up so far and are open to more food truck signups
 - Dozens of vendors all along Brookline Blvd
- Food Truck Tuesday: every Tuesday
 - Turnout has been fantastic! The trucks love coming to Brookline and really appreciate our support. We will likely be adding a second food truck each week to keep up with demand.
- o Jacob / Whited Construction
 - Community Garden construction will occur throughout summer 2021!
 - Grading of the construction site will begin in mid-May. A Brookline resident (who requested to remain anonymous) is volunteering their time and equipment to do the grading work.
 - Another Brookline resident is donating their labor to do the necessary plumbing work, and has connected us with his supplier to purchase necessary supplies at a discounted rate.
 - We are in need of some tree work if anyone has a connection to a tree service that may be able to offer any discounts for tree service, please contact Bill Kim or e-mail us at brooklinetogether@gmail.com.
 - Our Love Your Block grant application this year would be used to upgrade the neighborhood welcome sign at the Jacob/Whited site.
- Neighborhood mural
 - Prepping the wall near the dugout of the baseball fields at the Rec Center for the addition of a neighborhood mural – the entire project will take some time, but the ground is being laid during summer 2021
- City of Pittsburgh events presentation from Gisele Betances from Mayor Peduto's office
 - Love Your Block grant program for 2021 will be launched in the next few weeks, and Gisele will send us the link when application submissions are available.
 - City Cuts (where the city hires contractors to help with lawn care for older adults, veterans, and people with disabilities) is not yet up and running due to lack of funding, but they are hopeful it'll be back up and running before the end of summer
 - Citiparks is looking for lifeguards to open some of the city-owned pools. Training and certification will be provided. Applications are being taken on the website https://pittsburghpa.gov/citiparks/lifeguard-info
 - Weekly coding lessons for kids are available on Tuesdays at 4pm all summer

- City Councilman Anthony Coghill's office
 - Supply chain delays in receiving materials have caused some delays in the necessary renovations at Moore Pool. We are still hopeful it'll open for July 4 but are not yet sure.
 - Note: Pipes beneath the pool were broken and causing huge leaks affecting the pool and the baseball fields below. These repairs are absolutely necessary. Fortunately, repairing these leaks will save so much water that the repairs will pay for themselves after several years.
 - You can formally request a traffic calming measure on your street (signage, addition of a stop sign, speed humps) by having neighbors on your block sign a petition. The City will then conduct a traffic study and respond appropriately. Please feel free to reach out to the Council office for help. www.pittsburghpa.gov/domi/traffic-calming
 - The city's Café Permitting is working well, to allow businesses to use sidewalk space outside their businesses to extend their dining space to the outdoors. Red's Good News took advantage of this permit and recently reopened on Brookline Blvd with the addition of outdoor seating using the café permit.

Project Name: Brookline Community Mural

Project Scope: To create a mural that celebrates Brookline's residents and history, while looking forward to the possibilities that our youngest community members will one day create.

Project Location: Brookline Memorial Park - 1399 Oakridge St, Pittsburgh, PA 15226 - The wall facing the dek hockey rink that used to be the bathrooms and changing rooms for the Rec Center Pool (now obsolete). This site includes bathrooms and concession stand currently being renovated for neighborhood sports teams by the City of Pittsburgh. Wall is approximately 150ft long and 25ft high at its tallest point.

Project Description: Over the past 5 months, a community art therapy intern provided by partnering nonprofit organization, Brookline Teen Outreach, has been conducting interviews with community members focused on the history and future of the neighborhood and what should be captured in the mural to reflect the community as a whole. The scope of the mural project is community focused as it considers the future of the community and its members. The mural may also provide a way to build connections among community members and the neighborhood youth organization. The mural will provide an opportunity to use the resources we have as well as branching out and deepening community relationships.

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




